EARLY LEARNING

At the YMCA of Metro Atlanta, we believe every child deserves the chance to thrive, no matter their background or zip code. Our early learning programs are designed to nurture brain development and build essential language literacy, social, and problemsolving skills during a child's most critical years. From infant care to preschool and pre-K to family engagement, the Y supports more than 2,900 children each year with safe, high-quality environments where they can learn, grow, and shine.

Two of our most impactful offerings are Head Start and Early Head Start, federally funded programs that support families from pregnancy through age five.

THE YMCA HAS BEEN A TRUSTED HEAD START PROVIDER SINCE 1999. IN 2024, WE EXPANDED TO RICHMOND COUNTY, BRINGING THESE LIFE-CHANGING SERVICES TO AN ADDITIONAL 800 CHILDREN AND **FAMILIES IN AUGUSTA.**

We know Head Start works: children in the program are more likely to graduate from high school, attend college, and avoid the criminal justice system. In 2024, thanks to access to free, comprehensive childcare, 97% of our Head Start children completed the program ready for kindergarten, and 80% of their parents were employed and empowered to support their families.




SPOTLIGHT: JAYCE'S STORY

They focused on building his vocabulary through daily language practice, patiently encouraging him to use his words and engage with others. Slowly, Jayce began to speak up. Then he started to play, share, and smile more often. Today, he confidently expresses how he feels and chooses his favorite classroom activities with ease.



SPOTLIGHT: AFTER DARK SUMMER BASKETBALL LEAGUE

At the South DeKalb YMCA, the gym lights stayed on a little later last summer, for all the right reasons. In partnership with the DeKalb County Police Athletic League, the Y hosted the After Dark Summer Basketball League, a seven-week program that provided teens with a safe, structured place to play, learn, and connect.

More than 120 players hit the court, supported by mentorship and mandatory workshops focused on education and career readiness. The impact reached far beyond the game, nearly 1,400 community members came out to cheer, and a dozen teens were employed to help run the program, gaining valuable work experience in the process. For some players, participation even led to college scholarships.

When Paul J. Tom was diagnosed with Parkinson's, he didn't let it define him—and neither did the Y. At the Cowart Family YMCA, Paul found more than a place to work out. He found encouragement, support, and a community that pushes him forward.

With the help of our instructors and specialized programs like Knockout Parkinson's Boxing, Movement, and Balance/Stability classes, Paul is now more active than ever. These classes, while designed with Parkinson's in mind, also support individuals managing stroke, MS, and other movement-related conditions. Paul credits the YMCA of Metro Atlanta for helping him feel stronger and more in control of his health.

Each week, we offer more than 3,000 group exercise classes across the metro area, including 300 tailored specifically for active older adults.

HEALTH EQUITY

Health outcomes shouldn't be determined by your ZIP code, but in Atlanta, they often are. According to the Atlanta Regional Commission, a child born in Sandy Springs can expect to live 25 years longer than a child born just a few miles away in Bankhead. That kind of disparity is unacceptable, and the YMCA of Metro Atlanta is committed to being part of the solution by showing up in the neighborhoods where the need is greatest and delivering programs that close the gap.

Since 1858, we have been committed to breaking down barriers and meeting people where they are, especially in communities too often overlooked. Today, we continue that work through programs that address real, immediate needs like water safety and drowning prevention, hunger relief, and free dental care and vision screenings.

With the support of donors and partners, we're reaching deeper into neighborhoods with the fewest resources, delivering health and wellness programming that's responsive, inclusive, and grounded in equity.

Youth & Teens Received Financial Assistance, Nearly Doubling Access to the Y since 2023



Last summer, on pool decks across metro Atlanta, thousands of kids gripped the edge of the pool, nervous but determined. For many it was their first swim lesson, or their first time in a pool. They were part of the Y's Safety Around Water class, a program designed to ensure that every child, no matter their background, has the chance to learn life-saving skills.

In 2024, the YMCA of Metro Atlanta provided 1,885 free swim lessons to children across the city, many in communities where access to swim instruction has historically been out of reach. The goal was not just to teach kids to swim—but to close racial and economic drowning disparities that persist in our city. We didn't take on this challenge alone. As a founding member of the Atlanta Water Safety Coalition, we worked alongside the City of Atlanta Parks & Recreation Department, Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, the American Red Cross, and WABE to raise awareness, expand lifeguard training, teach CPR, and advocate for stronger safety policies.



By the end of the summer, we had kids floating confidently on their backs and paddling across the pool, proud and smiling. And throughout metro Atlanta, kids walked away from their lessons stronger, safer, and ready for whatever comes next.




